The facility can accommodate up to 65,000 attendees for a program that will incorporate Indigenous traditions as part of the gathering.

All tickets are free. You will have an opportunity to make a contribution to support the Papal Visit if you wish to do so. Individuals may order up to 6 tickets for Mass. ### **Common Wealth Stadium - Questions and Answers**

Will I need to present my ticket at entry?

- Yes. Please bring your ticket on a mobile device so that it may be verified upon arrival.

If I am a volunteer do I need to get a ticket?

- Volunteers do not need to order a ticket but will receive information from the volunteer team on accessing sites and other relevant directions.

What can I bring inside Commonwealth Stadium? Will concessions be open?

- Concessions will NOT be open at Commonwealth Stadium. Participants may bring clear bags that are 12"x 12"x 6" and non clear bags under 4.5" x 6.5" with snacks and juice/water (no glass containers). Please refer to the Commonwealth Stadium guidelines for what is permitted and not permitted. (See below)

How soon should I arrive?

- Mass will start promptly at 10:15 a.m. Please allow extra time as there will be screening of all guests upon arrival. You are encouraged to arrive by 8:30 a.m.

What if I am a journalist wanting to cover this event?

- Accredited journalists will be permitted inside the stadium to cover the event at identified positions. Transportation for journalists accredited for the Mass will be provided from the media centre to the facility. Journalists without accreditation will not be permitted entry to the facility. ***Prohibited items include, but are not limited to: purses larger than a clutch bag, coolers, briefcases, backpacks, fanny packs, cinch bags, non-approved seat cushions, luggage of any kind, computer bags and camera bags or any bag larger than the permissible size.***

## **Stadium Policies**

### **Alcohol Policy**

---

All guests who appear under the age of 25 will be required to show valid government-issued ID to purchase alcohol. Guests serving alcohol to minors will be subject to arrest. Alcohol may not be brought into the stadium. Guests attempting to bring alcohol into the stadium will be denied entry or removed. Any guest that is denied entry or removed for any violation of facility rules will not be issued a refund.

An alcohol policy is in effect to assist with responsible consumption. Individuals who appear to be intoxicated will be removed from the premises in a taxi or with a sober family member or a friend. Drunk and disorderly behaviour may also result in arrest and prosecution. Members of the Commonwealth Stadium staff and Edmonton Police Service are available to assist at all times and the public is asked to report any unacceptable behaviour.

### **Smoking and Drug Policy**

---

Commonwealth Stadium is a non-smoking facility. Smoking tobacco, vaping and cannabis consumption in a non-designated area will result in ejection from the stadium without refund.

Any form of Cannabis consumption or possession is prohibited on Commonwealth Stadium property at all times including stadium parking lots.

Smoking (tobacco and vaping) is only permitted in designated smoking areas outside gates 3,7,8,12. Please ask Stadium staff if you require assistance.

## Bag Policy

---

All bags are subject to inspection upon entry and are subject to additional inspections within the stadium. Please have your bag open ready for inspection before entering the gates.

**We have implemented a [Clear Bag Policy](#) to reduce physical contact.**

Guests with clear bags can use our Express lanes, resulting in a faster entry.

Visit our Team Store for branded clear bags for purchase. There will be Elks merchandise tents at each gate that will have team branded clear bags available for purchase as well.

To ensure a safe environment for the public, eliminate unnecessary contact at entry gates, and to accelerate fan entry into the stadium, Commonwealth Stadium and the Edmonton Elks have implemented a Clear Bag policy that limits the size and type of bags that can be brought into the stadium. Exceptions to this policy will be made for all medically necessary items after proper inspection.

Commonwealth Stadium strongly encourages fans to not bring any type of bags, but fans will be able to carry the following style and size of bag, package, or container:

- Bags that are clear plastic, vinyl or PVC and do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12." (Official Edmonton Elks team logo clear plastic tote bags will be available starting August 7, 2022 at team store outlets or [online](#))
- No buckles, grommets/hardware or décor can conceal any part of the bag. It must be all clear.
- One-gallon clear plastic freezer bag (zipper bag or similar)
- Small clutch bags, which cannot exceed 4.5" x 6.5" in size, with or without a handle or strap can be taken into the stadium with one of the clear plastic bags

Prohibited items include, but are not limited to: purses larger than a clutch bag, coolers, briefcases, backpacks, fanny packs, cinch bags, non-approved seat cushions, luggage of any kind, computer bags and camera bags or any bag larger than the permissible size.
